The Academia network: a programme for guidance practitioners from guidance practitioners

Academia has been for more than 25 years the only Network in Europe from 'practioners for practioners' in Career Guidance and Counselling. The Project Academia+ uses the potential of the network and creates transnational developed training units to professionalize Career Guides and Counsellers from all over Europe.

Challenges and European Benefit

Guidance practitioners will be able to learn more about current approaches to tackle current challenges. They also have the chance to learn from other countries' approaches and experiences, both in theory and in practice. Academia + raises the Academia network on a higher level and prepares it for the future creating a digital learning environment which supports the oneweek-learning units.

Effects and estimated outcomes

In the current decisive phase of the development of labour markets in the European Union the Academia+ project provides an opportunity to develop researchbased Study and Training Exchange Programmes. Instead of isolated approaches which are not sufficient to cope with the challenges of the refugee crises, demographic change and digitisation/future jobs, the project from scratch uses a determined European approach concering the selected issues.

The Academia+ project

Project Aims

The Project brings together two perspectives:

a) to support and consolidate the exchange of knowledge and transnational training of career guidance and counselling practitioners in Europe and

b) to focus on the development of training programmes to address current key challenges in the European labour market as well as the theory and practice of guidance and counselling.

The Intellectual Outputs (O1 - O3) consist of one-week -study courses for transnational participants coming from partner countries.
